

WHO'S WHO

Alfonso "Oni" Aliomar (Cactus Clay) Oni is new to the Sunol stage however he has previously appeared in several other plays such as *Taming of the Shrew, Bye-Bye Birdie, The Music Man, Measure for Measure* and church plays. He is also the creator of The Renaissance Brigade facebook page.

Patti Balch (Terrible Tilly) Patti has participated a phenomenal 31 years with SRT! Some of her favorite roles were Otis Crummy, Conchita, Crazy Nannette, Sarah Sweetflower, Purity Snow, Miss Kitty Litter, Candy Cane, Sybil Chasteen, Sheriff Helda, Tootsie and 20+ more and she says "Gosh, I loved them all!" One of her most memorable stage experiences was playing Sarah Sweetflower and riding down a ramp in a coal car before plunging offstage into the hallway and not knowing (but hoping) that a crew member was waiting to catch her before hitting the opposite wall. Yes, folks, those screams were real! Patti enjoys instrument and acrobatic pilot as well as spending time with grandkids, playing golf, fly fishing and boating. She is a faux artist/muralist and owner of PWB Design.

Donna Blevins (Mademoiselle Gallette) Donna is happy to be in her first melodrama and fifth consecutive play with SRT. She is often seen playing eccentric, diva roles such as a detective and a cop in *House of Horrors* and *How the Other Half Dies*, a shrill hotel owner in *Hotel Escargot* and a clairvoyant in *Axe of Murder*. Donna adapts scripts and narrates Readers Theater for Livermore Shakespeare. In May, Donna performs in *An American Daughter* with Encore Players. She says "I'm not crazy, my reality is just different from yours!".

Lea Blevins (Cordelia Langley) Lea is pleased to be in her fifth consecutive production with SRT, portraying the editor of the Gravel Gulch Gazette. Lea brings her real-life experience as a former intrepid newspaper reporter to the Sunol stage. In recent years she co-directed SRT's *How the other Half Dies* and served as secretary for two years on SRT's Board of Directors. Lea has also performed with Encore Players in Livermore and San Ramon. She would like to thank her amazing friends and loved ones who support these shows!

Sandi Bohner (Aunt Edna) Sandi has held a variety of positions with SRT since her debut 16 years ago; many of which were behind the scenes as ticket sales, publicity manager and producer. One of her most memorable and challenging roles was dying in *Ax of Murder* and

falling asleep while "playing dead" during the first act, yep, she really did fall asleep! Sandi enjoys the camaraderie of SRT and especially being involved with a group which donates it's proceeds to Sunol Glen School. Sandi enjoys creating yummy treats for your furry friends in her new business, "Bubbe's Critter Creations."

Soraia Bohner (Generosity) Soraia has acted in a few small school performances and first donned our stage 6 years ago with her grandmother Sandi Bohner. Her most enjoyable theater experience is being able to meet and interact with fellow SRT thespians. Soraia is a student at Harvest Park Middle School.

Mike Brown (Raspy) Mike has been badly acting for almost 60 years, starting with a couple of completely forgettable appearances in church pageants as Goliath and the myrrh bearing Magi. Eventually Mike realized that chemistry was a better gig for him (at least he got paid) and he gave up the theater deal for more than 40 years (although continuing to act badly in other venues). His theater bug reappeared completely inappropriately when he was selected to play the hero in 2004's *Caught in the Villian's Web* and he has been ingraciously treading the SRT stage on and off since then.

Bob Canning (Muletrain) Another newcomer to SRT, Bob has had plenty of stage experience working with the Livermore Valley Opera in *Madame Butterfly* and *The Flying Dutchman*; and the Livermore Amateur Theater Group in *Our Town*. His most memorable role has been playing a ghost sailor in *The Flying Dutchman*. Bob is a Litigation Consultant with Sodgwick CMS. A big thank you to Bob's better half, Patty, as she joins us this year as our prompter!

Grare Davis (Pecos Pest) This is Grare's 11th year in SRT and she has done everything from prompting and sweeping floors to painting, producing, stage managing and acting. This year she is a singing bandito. Grare enjoys traveling (recently eating piranha!) quilting, crocheting and grade B horror movies. A special thanks to Allen Schell for instigating and supporting her acting career.

Tazlina Dentinger (Cheerful) Tazzy first appeared in last years production of *Axe of Murder* as Officer Pointdexter. The Foothill High student's most memorable stage experience was being able to play a scatterbrained, Robin Hood in her school's performance of *Mother Goose's Fairy Tales*.

Violeta Dentinger (Misty) Another SRT first time-timer, Violeta joins sister Tazlina in this years performance. This Sunol Glen School 4th

grader's big stage break began with a skit at Camp Butano Creek.

Barbara Egbert (Stage Manager/Asst. to Producer) Barbara has been involved with SRT since her daughter (Mary, now in graduate school) first appeared on stage as a 5 year old sign girl. She has served SRT as actor, producer, house manager and stage manager. Barbara's most memorable time on stage was as Dr. Joanna Vandeveer in 2013's *Murder in the House of Horrors*. Away from the theater, she is an editor at Stanford University.

Emma Feeney (Flenda) Although new to our stage, this young lady has lots of theatrical experience. From *Casablanca* to *A Christmas Carol*, Emma's most memorable role was a dancer in *Women* and as Flounder in *The Laramie Project: 10 Years Later*. Emma is a substitute teacher and speech coach.

Judy Fenton (Little Louisa) Judy has recently performed in *A Christmas Carol* where she was able to sing and dance. She has also performed with the Pleasanton Civic Arts, Pleasanton Senior Players and Children's Theater Workshop. Linda Hinshaw-Kramm (Abagail Pettigrew) While this is Linda's 4th season with SRT (previously appearing in *Rogue of the Railway, Murder in the House of Horrors, How the Other Half Dies* and *Ax of Murder*), she has quite a bit of previous stage experience. She majored in drama and minored in dance in college and was president of her high school Thespian Society. Linda is a retired IBM Field Engineer and volunteers on staff for the Strawberry Music Festival twice a year. She also serves as Precinct Inspector for the Alameda County ROC during elections.

Derek Johnson (Technical Director) While sitting on the back stoop of the Kilkare Woods clubhouse at a Halloween party 20 years ago, Derek promised Stephan Doyle that he would "help push stuff around backstage"... only to be cast as policeman Willy Ketchum in *Peril on the High Seas*. This year he is in charge of pushing stuff around back stage as Technical Director. Derek is a self-employed software engineer/scientist who lives and works in Sunol.

Victorian King-Bowman (Lotta Crabapple) Victorian is very excited to be returning for her sixth season with SRT and it's been five years since she played the role of a Shakespearean actress. She has acted, sang, and danced before audiences in San Ramon, Brentwood, Castro Valley, San Leandro, Sunnyvale, Pleasanton and Livermore. Victorian is also a board member with Encore Players acting group in Livermore. She

thanks her family, friends, fellow actors and especially her husband for all of their support.

Logan March (Johnny Lasso) This is Logan's first year with SRT and he says he is having a blast with all his fellow actors. He comes to us with lots of stage experience and greatly appreciates the support he receives from friends and family. Logan is thrilled to have you make it to our show! He says, "There's a ruckus going down in Gravel Gulch".

Phil Mumford (Banker Boyle) This retired Sunol Glen School teacher has an exclusive contract with SRT (lucky us!). One of his favorite SRT moments was sawing Mary Chambers in half and throwing knives at Patty Balch. An avid bicyclist, Phil recently completed an around the world tour.

Josh Replogle (Billy Berry) This is Josh's 2nd year with SRT. He is an avid historian reader (especially military) and loves military themed games, books and creating military strategies. This high school freshman's future plans include going to Georgetown University, studying abroad, joining the Peace Corps and working as a diplomat in the US Department of State. Ashley Ruzicka (Sunny Day) A veteran of SRT, Ashley has performed in theater and dance for many years. 
